Year

12 AD – JESUS IS CALLED OUT OF THE HOLY LAND

Based on Isaiah 1 v 12, the Spirit whisks Jesus out of the Holy Land for a time – 'who has required this to tread my courts?'. This is the 19th year in the life of Christ – and like Abram the Spirit is calling him by faith to a land he does not know.

Based on Songs 8 v 2, we believe Jesus moves to Syria – 'my mother's house'. Sarai was from Syria, Rebecca was from Syria, and the two wives of Jacob were from Syria. All the mothers of the patriarchs were from Syria. That pretty much seals the land location.

Genesis 12 says Abram dwelt in Egypt. In this case, Jesus can do both because the Romans rule Syria. Like the Egyptians, the Romans have a supreme Emperor, they worship pagan idols, and they put faith in their mighty military to dominate all neighbors.

Abram, Isaac, and Jacob all sojourned outside the Promised Land. All failed to carry a witness of godliness in the land of foreigners. Instead they proved themselves to be liars and weak under trial. Of course, Jesus did not fail these tests. We will see in verses to come.
