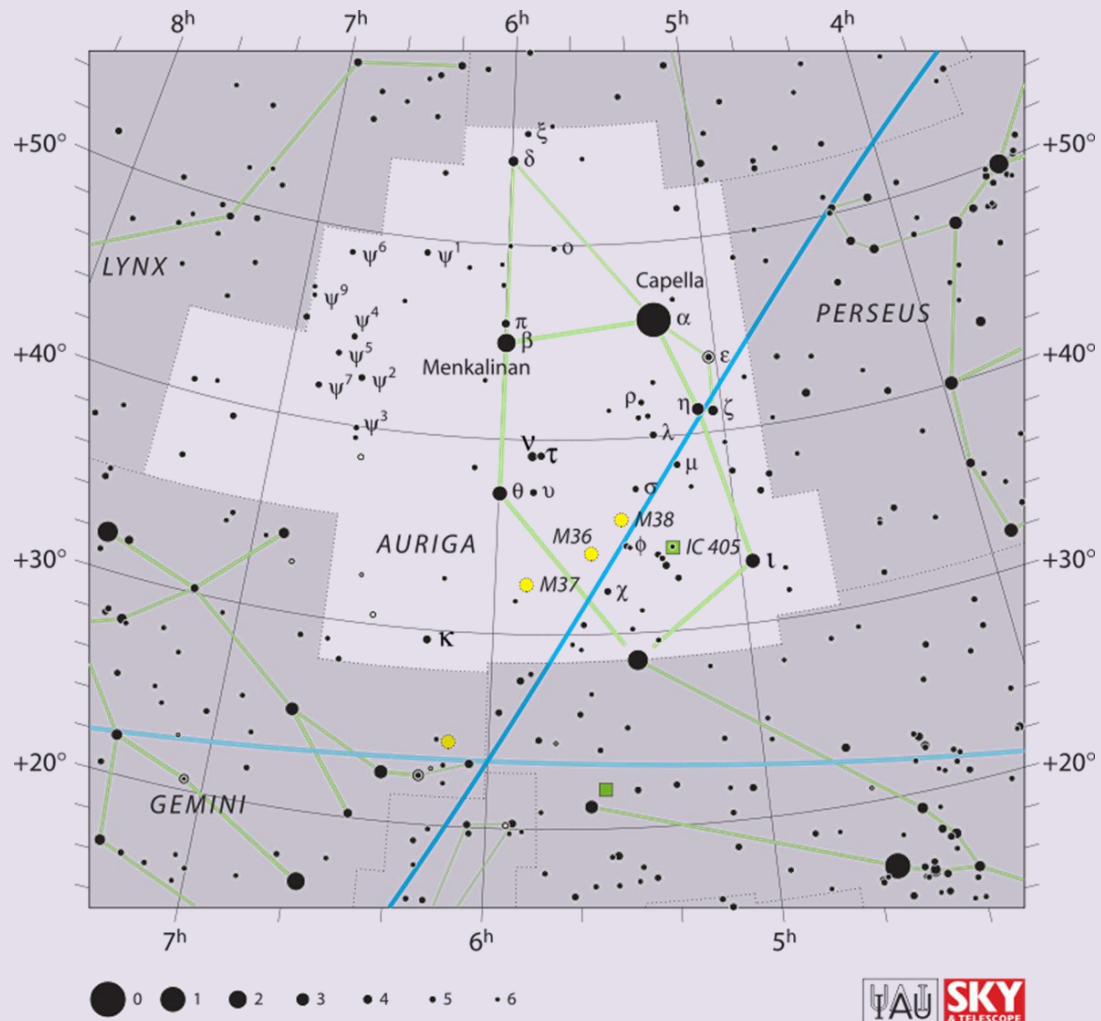

SIGN MEANING:

MELTING POT (Erasing Age-old Cultural Norms, Beliefs, Identities)

BIBLE NUMBER 35 MEANING: (Our interpretation)

"SUFFERING SERVANT" (e.g. Jacob - see discussion of star Capella below)

SOLOMON'S WISDOM: (Proverbs Chapter 30 speech on the Heavenly Signs)

"This is the way of an adulterous woman; she eats and wipes her mouth;
and says 'I have done no wickedness'" [FEMALE GOAT] (v.20)

BIBLE BOOK: HABBAKUK

KEY VERSES: ch. 2 v 8

"Because you have plundered many nations, the remnant of the people will plunder you."

SIGN DESCRIPTION:

SEATED RULER WITH FEMALE GOAT IN HIS LAP

SIGN INTERPRETATION: (per Genesis 35)

"And it happened, when Israel dwelt in that land, that Reuben went and lay with Bilhah his father's concubine: and Israel heard about it." (Gen. 35 v 22) Reuben was firstborn. That meant Reuben was in line to inherit the mantle of head of the family. But God had a different plan: he was going to send all of them down to Egypt because they had failed in their mission to be a light to the world (see our paper CANIS MINOR). In Egypt there would no longer be any head of the clan. All the Israelites would submit to Joseph and become Egyptian chattel: with privileges that could be withdrawn any time.

Thus the pleasuring of Reuben with a woman not his own became the harbinger of the entire clan of Israelites becoming submissive to Pharaoh, a man who had no right to rule them, but saw his chance in their moment of weakness and took full advantage.

In the past God had warned Egyptian rulers not to touch Israelite women on pain of harsh penalties: "The LORD plagued Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai Abram's wife" (Gen. 12 v 17). When Pharaoh absorbed the Israelites he must have thought they would inter-marry with the daughters of Ham, as Joseph did. However, it did not end that way. The Israelites lived in a separate district, Goshen, and retained their ethnic identity [although they did adopt many Egyptian customs and beliefs].

AURIGA is about a Ruler with Great Authority who brings peoples of other nations into submission but then mixes with them and promotes some to positions of high influence. Another example is Nebuchadnezzar, who promoted Daniel, much to the chagrin of the local wise men and astrologers. In the modern world with its liberal values the mixing of peoples in nations has occurred on a wide scale. But in Europe and the U.S. there has been an upswell of racism and right wing extremism. The lesson of the Bible is this: some people were never intended to mix. God divided the inheritances of the nations. If any man moves the boundary stones, he does so at his peril.

Capella: I Am Joseph

Bible Chapter: Genesis 45

Subject: Joseph makes himself known to his brothers; invites Jacob down to Egypt

Insight: Pharaoh made his first mistake by elevating Joseph, a foreigner, to high influence. Joseph had transformed himself. He talked and walked more like an Egyptian than the Egyptians. But Joseph used his influence to elevate his entire tribe in Egypt. This was terrible for Jacob, who lost headship of the clan. It was terrible for Pharaoh because God would bring plagues on his land for taking a woman that belonged to Abraham [i.e. pledged to Jehovah]. {Joseph is the FEMALE GOAT.}
