

**SIGN INTERPRETATION:** (per Genesis 50)

In Genesis 50 we see something amazing. Joseph honors the wishes of his father. Attended by chariots and horsemen all the family of Jacob plus Egyptians led by Joseph gave solemn lamentation for seven days at the threshing floor of Atad beyond the Jordan. Then Jacob's sons buried their father in the cave of Machpelah.

Jacob had been the rival of Joseph for the allegiance and affection of the clan. Now here was Joseph making a great public outpouring of grief at the death of Jacob. This is similar to the lamentation song of David for his fallen rival, King Saul: "**The beauty of Israel is slain!... How the mighty have fallen!**" (1 Samuel 1)

Where was David to be seen when Saul died on mount Gilboa? Oh yes. He was privateering from a base in the land of the Philistines. And where was Joseph to be seen, when Jacob was starving in Canaan? He was fattening himself in the land of Egypt. Neither was lifting a finger to save their rival from dying the death.

And where was Saul when Jesus was preaching? Oh yes. He was advancing in Judaism. And where was Saul when Stephen was martyred? Oh yes. He was assenting to his death. And yet, later we see Saul, now Paul, making great public lamentation for the death of Christ. A transformation almost beyond imagination.

The PUPPIS is the captain's castle at the back of the ship: the 'poop deck'. From here the captain barks his orders to the crew and steers the ship at sea. What do Joseph, David, and Paul have in common? They are the captain of the ship: everyone else is just a crew member who serves the captain. They are the so-called 'Great Men' of history. With drive, ambition, and charisma they changed the world: but for the worse.

Solomon said "**forceful wrath produces strife**". Yes Paul changed Christianity, but his forceful preaching let to competition among public teachers for the attention of believers, theological disputes, and clerical schisms. David's ambition expanded the borders of Israel but his plan to build a temple placed a heavy yoke on the people which ultimately led to the separation of Israel from Judah. Where there is FIRE: something is burnt.

After two thousand years of Christianity and the failure of religions organized around preachers to bring about revival of the faith you would think we would have learned this lesson. A fiery preacher accomplishes the opposite of the desired effect: people become alienated from God and society at large begins to see Christianity as an evil to be purged from their midst. Behold Roman persecutions!
